Ticket sales launched for Roma 2024 European Athletics Championships

Six days of competitions, eleven sessions in total and the chance to watch the best athletes in Europe from the iconic Olympic Stadium.

As of Thursday (17), ticket sales for the Roma 2024 European Athletics Championships from 7-12 June are now available for the general public to purchase. Athletics fans from all over the world can book their seats ten months in advance of one of the most significant and prestigious events on the road to the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

Ticket sales will be managed by Vivaticket, the ticketing advisor of the EuroRoma 2024 Foundation, who will guarantee a smooth, secure and digital purchasing experience.

Special promotions are planned including all morning session tickets going on sale for €5 and there will be a 10 percent discount on the first 5000 tickets issued during the World Athletics Championships in Budapest from 19-27 August.

From today (17), athletics fans can purchase tickets for individual sessions as well as many types of multi-session tickets.

A closer look at tickets

-Morning session tickets from €5. Spectators will have the opportunity to enjoy the atmosphere of the Olympic Stadium during the morning sessions by purchasing tickets for the price of $\in 5$.

- Evening session tickets from €20. Spectators will be able to purchase individual evening session tickets from as little as €20.

- 10% discount during the World Athletics Championships. There will be a 10 percent reduction in the sale price of the first 5000 tickets during the World Athletics Championships in Budapest from 19-27 August.

- Multi-day session tickets. Three-day session tickets are on sale for the first three days of competition (7-9 June) and for the last three days (10-12 June 2024). 'Weekend' and 'Ending Days' session tickets are available for all sections of the stadium with prices beginning from €125 and €80 respectively.

- All-In session tickets. For fans who don't want to miss a single minute of Rome 2024, an 'All in' ticket valid for all 11 sessions begins from €160.

What's on?

On the first evening session on Friday 7 June, the first medals will be awarded in the women's 20km race walk which will finish inside the Olympic Stadium. Reigning Olympic champion Antonella Palmisano will be among the medal favourites. The mixed 4x400m relay will also make its debut at the European Athletics Championships on the first day of competition.

The programme on 8 June includes the eagerly-awaited men's 100m final which looks set to feature reigning Olympic and European champion Marcell Jacobs as well as the men's long jump final and the possibility of a first senior medal for their outstanding young talent Mattia Furlani, the reigning European U18 and U20 champion.

On the morning session on 9 June, spectators inside the Olympic Stadium will be able to enjoy the finish of the men's and women's half marathons. The half marathon course will incorporate many of the city's most iconic and recognisable landmarks.

On the evening of Monday 10 June there will be six more finals, including the men's 200m final, the men's and women's 400m finals as well as the women's high jump final.

On Tuesday 11 June, the early awaited men's high jump final which looks set to feature Olympic and European champion Gianmarco Tamberi is one of eight finals scheduled for the penultimate evening session.

A Day 0 has been scheduled on 6 June, with an event reserved for the shot put qualifying competitions, which will be held at a special location in Rome. The public will be able to watch these competitions free of charge and will therefore not need to buy another ticket. Details of Day 0 will be announced at a later date.

And it's finals all the way on the last day of competition on Wednesday 12 June. Both men's and women's 4x100m and 4x400m finals are scheduled to take place along with the men's pole vault final in which two-time champion Armand Duplantis looks set to return to the venue where he cleared a world outdoor best of 6.15m in 2020.
